

Letter from Andrew Housley

Dear friends,



What influences you when choosing a pub for lunch, a car dealer, a utility provider, a holiday resort, or any other place where we spend our money? TV adverts can grab our attention, star ratings on online review sites are helpful, but what may influence us most, is a recommendation by a trusted friend.

'Word of mouth' is believed to be the most effective way to attract new customers to a business or members to a club. 

Tudor Glassworks By Owen Taylor

Prior to the publication of the 'William Yates Map' of 1786, very little was known about the local topographical features of our landscape. Most information gathered originated from old church records, legal documents and place names.


A typical example was an obscure entry discovered during the spring of 1968 in the Ormskirk Parish Registers. It became a vital clue in the discovery of a small 'Glassworks' at Bickerstaffe. The entry, dated 10th December 1600, reads, 'A stranger slayne by one of the glassmen beinge a ffrenchman then working at Bycerstaff.' The site was located in a Bickerstaffe Hall field, known as Glass Hey, to the West of Hall Lane.




Map showing the site of the Glassworks

For generations, local Teamsmen had uncovered fragments of green glass and glazed pottery in the area, not knowing their significance.

In 1968, an excavation was carried out by the staff of the Pilkington Museum, led by local Curator, Miss Ruth Hurst, who suggested at the time, 'the green tinted vessel glass was typical of the products made by French Huguenot Glassmakers, who emigrated to England in the 1560's.'

After the removal of top-soil and many tons of red burnt earth, a large oblong platform was exposed. The stone used was similar to that once quarried at the old Melling Delph. More digging revealed the base of a melting-pot, about one-foot in diameter, known as 'crucibles'. Also, a substantial quantity of charcoal debris was found near the foundation of the furnace.

It was big news for local newspapers, who carried photographs and stories of the event. Moreover, Lord Pilkington invited the Parish Council to view the historical site, which resulted in a full turn out of members one Sunday afternoon. A later analysis revealed that about 50% of the wood burned was Hazel, then quite common in the near-by woodlands. An entry in the Elizabethan Quarter Sessions, endorses this review and reads, 'Edward Mercer, labourer of Kirkbie, on 14th Jan. 1598, entered a Bickerstath wood and cut sown 42 young hassel, worth 12 pence, the property of Henry Stanley, Esq'.

Where the Glassmen lived is unknown. At that period of the 17th Century, there were few farmsteads in the Southern part of the Township due to the extent of un-drained moss-land. Two small farms situated within a quarter of a mile of the glass site, were recorded in the

Victorian era. Both were occupied by the Corcorhan family. The one in Hall Lane was demolished in 1911, while the other, off New Way, met a similar fate in the mid-1960s.

It was near to this location during the 1980s, that a metal detector enthusiast found two French coins. Both were well worn and the dates were indiscernible.

What happened to the French Glassmen is not recorded. Court Registers omit any mention of an arrest or prosecution for the felony reported in December 1600, so it seems they packed up and skedaddled very quickly, realising that if caught, they would be executed.

Opposite the discovered glassworks, stood an ancient mile-stone, which unfortunately was stolen in May 2000. Some Bickerstaffe elders reckoned it measured a four mile distance to the old market-cross in Ormskirk.


Editorial News: A big 'thank you!'
