


'The Bickerstaffe Chapel' By Owen Taylor

The Bickerstaffe Chapel is believed to be the oldest place of interment in Ormskirk Church.




Plan of Ormskirk Church. Drawn from the V.C.H.

Interesting evidence to support this theory came to light during the restoration of the church in 1877. After the floor had been excavated to a depth of three feet, the base of an altar tomb and part of a medieval column were discovered.



Also discovered in 1877, a slotted window, situated at the East wall of the Chapel.



Moreover, in 1881, a study of Mason Marks, led by the Lancs ad Cheshire Historical Society, reveals many intriguing examples of identical marks found on the wall of the Bickerstaffe Chapel and at the ruins of Burscough Priory.

Two sets of identical Mason-Marks indicating same 'Masons' were employed on each edifice. Note: Mason-Marks are recognised as the signature of the scriber.



Adjacent to them in the North Aisle, lies the Catholic Family of Mossock. Situated here is a brass plaque, claiming a family grave has existed since 1276. An ode composed by Fr. Richard Mossock, states, 'My Ancestors have beene interred heare 385 years.' He inherited Mossock Hall and the Family Estate after returning from the Continent in the mid 17th century.

The early involvement in the Bickerstaffe families in Church affairs was evident in 1366, when Ralf de Bickerstath subscribed 12 pence towards the stipend of a priest. Again, at the beginning of the 16th century, Thomas Atherton of Bickerstath was responsible for the foundation of a Chantry, an altar dedicated to 'Our Lady of Pity' and for a priest to offer Mass for

the soul of Thomas and his ancestors. The Chantry was dismantled at the reformation.

Two tombs, which now lie in the Derby Chapel, were originally erected in the Bickerstaffe Chapel. They were constructed on the orders of Margaret Stanley of Bickerstaffe and Crosshall and display 12 Coats of Arms, bearing the charges of Bickerstath, Atherton, Scarisbrick, Mossock and Stanley families. Although the brass plates are missing, (probably ripped off during the Civil War) the Townley Mss. gives most of the inscription. 'In ye Church of Ormschurche in ye Co. Lancaster – of charity pray for ye souls of James Scarisbrick of Bickerstaffe and Margarett, his wife and Elizabeth their daughter deceased ye 18th daye of Jan, in ye year of our Lord God 1517 and ye same James dec'ed ye ------day of ------ in ye year of -----. On ye tomb there is ye portraitures of a man and a woman in brass.'

The sable Cross Patonce, the heraldic shield from the Coat of Arms of the Bickerstath family, can still be recognised almost 400 years since it was painted on the tomb.

*Addendum to July's Article - 'The Skelmersdale Carnival'



Planting A Biblical Garden

No plant is mentioned more times in the Bible than the grape and its products, chiefly wine but also raisins and vinegar. Wine gladdens the hearts of men (*Psalm 104:15*) and is used at symbolic occasions such as Passover and the Last Supper. David's men rejoiced with raisins (*1Chronicles 12-40*).



Pruning is essential if the vine is to produce fruit. This is referred to in several scriptures, in *Isaiah* 5:6 and the most well-known *John* 15:1-2,

"I am the real vine, and my Father is the gardener. He breaks off every branch in me that does not bear fruit, so that it will be clean and bear more fruit".

Commercial wine growing has increased in the UK over recent years. But the old fashioned grape

Black Hamburg can still be found in some garden greenhouses – it is a very sweet variety which has done really well in recent years. The most famous Hamburg vine was planted in Hampton Court in 1768 by Capability Brown and still produces hundreds of bunches of grapes.

Liverpool Cathedral News

How to Pray



"Teach us to pray" is a practical course looking at different ways of praying, and is held at the Liverpool Cathedral Dining Room 9:15am-10:15am starting on Sunday 8th October.

One of the most honest requests of the disciples was when they asked Jesus – "Teach us to pray." Something that should be so straight forward can be more tricky than we think and also much greater than we often realise. This is a very practical course where we will look at different ways of praying each session and do some of them. You will not be asked to do anything you are uncomfortable with but my prayer is that together we will grow in our conversations with God.

This includes eight sessions on October 8th, 15th, 22nd, 29th, November 5th, 12, 19th, and 26th. Cost: Free, donations welcome.
