### **Letter from Andrew Housley**

Dear Friends,

The other week, I went to the cinema to see the new film, Dunkirk. It's a great film, which doesn't sensationalize the evacuation, but manages to tell the story of how the event changed people's lives. The courage and heroism of individuals was inspirational and has contributed to our national character. Nowadays, we use the term 'Dunkirk spirit' when the odds are stacked against us and we are determined not to give up. We encourage ourselves to face a challenge with courage and determination, just like those who sailed in boats of all sizes to rescue over 300,000 soldiers from Dunkirk's beaches.

I recently heard again the story of the time Jesus ascended to heaven and was met by an angel who asked Him what the plan was. Jesus mentioned that he'd left his few disciples to spread the good news of the Kingdom to the ends of the earth. The Angel looking down to see the motley crew hiding in an upper room, and asked Jesus "What is plan B?" Jesus answered, "there is no plan B". In the power of the Holy Spirit, the disciples managed to achieve what was expected of them.

When we face a challenge, we are not alone. The Spirit of God, the communion of the Saints and the fellowship of the Church stand with us. In 2 Corinthians 12:9 we read, 'But Jesus said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me.'

I pray that we may know the love and support of those alongside us, as we go through life with courage and determination.

### Visit to Al-Rahma Mosque, Liverpool

The visit to the mosque will be on Tuesday 17th October 2017 at 1.30pm, leaving St Michael's about 12.30pm. If you would like to come, please put a tick next to your name on the list at the back of church. Below is a list of requests from the mosque.

1. Visitors and worshippers are required to dress modestly. This means that men are required to wear shirts and long pants, ladies are required to wear long shirts, dresses or trousers and long sleeves. It is also courteous of women to wear a head scarf in the mosque, although, not absolutely necessary.

- 2. Shoes will need to be removed and placed on the racks provided before entering the internal area of the mosque. Outside the mosque shoes are to be worn at all times.
- 3. No food or drink may be consumed inside the mosque and mobile phones should be switched off. Please observe the ambience of the place and refrain from loud talking and shouting. If prayers take place, during the time of the visit, then please either stand or sit at the back and maintain complete silence.

### 'So what are you waiting for?'

The season of Advent bends time itself. And for us, time drags or speeds by, depending on our circumstances and stage of life. Our attitude to time gives us clues about our attitude towards God.

It's a cliché to say that we live our lives often waiting for life to start, but that's what many people experience, until they realise that they were living their lives all along. Christ, for whom we wait and to whom we will return, is both beyond us and beside us; outside time and bound by human time.

Whether you're always in a hurry or have too much time on your hands, this course is for you, as we explore a spiritual life that encourages us to be active in the chronological world, and rooted in *Kairos*, God's time.

The four sessions are: 1. Go with haste; 2. How Long O Lord how long?; 3. Prepare the way of the Lord!; and 4. Kairos and Chronos: is time running out?



Our home grown tree's come from right here in Lancashire, and our family's own 300 acre forest in the Scottish Highlands, where all our trees are replanted two-fold. ### **Planting a Biblical Garden**



Tamarisks, are very common trees and shrubs in the Middle East, especially in soils with high salt concentration and are therefore the only trees found on the shores of the Dead Sea.

During the heat of the day the tamarisk secretes salt, a process very wasteful of water. The salt dries. During the night, the salt absorbs water from the air. In the morning, the water evaporates creating a sort of

natural air-conditioning. This cooling effect is another reason for its popularity as a shade tree.

Abraham planted a tamarisk tree at Beersheba (*Genesis 21:33*). Why? Trees were often used as memorials for great men. It is therefore appropriate that Abraham should honour God by planting the tamarisk. It would be a permanent memorial of the covenant between the two. Saul was sitting under one, spear in hand, when he heard news of David's rebellion against him (*1 Samuel 22:6*). Later, when Saul and his 3 sons fell in battle, the triumphant Philistines hung their bodies from the wall of Beth Shan, but Saul's men rescued them and buried the bones honourably under a tamarisk tree (*1 Samuel 31:13*).

Tamarisks have a heather like appearance and produce pink or white flowers. You can definitely grow them in your garden in West Lancashire. In fact, I have seen the pink variety down Church Road, Litherland!!
