'Bickerstaffe Roots' By Owen Taylor

Although Bickerstaffe is not entered in the Doomsday Survey of 1086, the Community's name came into existence soon after this date.

The earliest record is found in the King's Pipe Roll, c.1150, which states, "Of Alan son of Bernolf of Thanage, in Byckerstath 5 shillings" (a tenure of land held by a Thane).

From 1180 to 1208 we find references to Bickerstaffe in many ancient documents, such as the 'Testa de Nevill' and the 'Scarisbrick Charters", but the main source of early information appears in the record books of the Monastic House of Cockersand Abbey.

An interesting entry in the Chartulary (their book of accounts), states that Adam de Bickerstad gave the "Abbot of Kockersand" three and a half acres of his land, c.1200.

It was quite a common obsession for medieval Lords of Manors to give small parcels of land to the Abbots, hoping thereby to gain favour in the afterlife.

But for the writings of the erstwhile Monks, much of the parish's early history would have been lost. The "Chartulary" describes many countryside names, now extinct. For example, a grant of land was made to the Canons in 1200 A.D, by Esward, son of Robert de Bickerstad, which was situated on both sides of the road, between the two lakes of Wildmere Ford and Witlache and then to Orpelles unto the Cross.

The Monks must have journeyed to the neighbourhood, a distance of 50 miles from the Lune Estuary where they lived.

A later item reads, 'Whereas contention had been removed from Ralf de Bickerstath and the Abbot in 1302 A.D, respecting a portion of mossland between Cunscough and the Crosses towards the North of the ancient Cross standing near Simonswood', thought by some Historians to be situated near Newton's Bridge.

If the Cross was ancient in 1302, it probably was of Anglo-Saxon origin. The first mention of a settlement is recorded in the "Episcopal Register" of 1379, when Nicholas de Atherton, (a son-in-law of the Bickerstath's) was granted a licence by the Bishop of Lichfield for an Oratory to be added to his Manor House. Later, this part of the house was referred to as the Bickerstaffe Chapel.

The Hearth Tax Returns of 1666, assessed the Manor House for 11 hearths, quite a substantial building for this era. Most of the original transactions were written in Latin and were transcribed into English by the Cheetham Society, in the late 19th Century.
